Can my student attend part-time at a traditional school while attending TC Virtual Academy (concurrent enrollment)? Students at TC Virtual Academy may take up to two courses at their school of residence concurrently (at the same time, space permitted) while they are full-time students at TC Virtual Academy.

Can my student return to a traditional school?

Yes, we recommend students who choose to return to traditional schools do so at a trimester or semester to help ensure continuity of coursework.

Please note: Online learning is not for everyone. It requires a great deal of self-discipline and self-monitoring, which are common characteristics of independent learners. Online classes also require a great deal of reading and interacting with others through the use of discussion boards and messaging.
