#### Connie Wu

- The Board has authorized to apply for the AB 841 grant. AB 841 is called The California Schools Healthy Air, Plumbing, and Efficiency (CalSHAPE) Ventilation Program. We received a Notice of Proposed Award (NOPA) this week for Assessment and Maintenance in the amount(s) of \$305,787.60 dollars for HVACs at TC High School and Longden. In order to secure the award funding, the Business Services Department will finish all the required additional forms and upload them online. Grant agreement will be submitted for Board's ratification on 3/23/22 Board meeting.
- The Board has approved the District to use ESSER funding for school site HVAC replacement. Under Federal Grant spending guidelines, any capital expenditure for special purpose equipment with a unit cost of over \$5,000 dollars requires a pre-approval. The District has submitted such approval and the request has been approved this week.

 Educational Services Department is working with Human Resource Services on identifying someone to come in and support the counseling team at the high school which has been a pressing issues for student wellness and support. Glad to see the challenges being met. Educational Services Update

#### Dr. Kataroyan

- Some updates on our 2 counselor positions: The DIS Counselor position was flown twice in January for about a month. There were 11 applicants and no one that met the qualifications- specifically they were missing the Marriage Family Therapy License or Clinical Social Worker License. We are still currently flying the DIS Counselor position. One applicant has applied but does not meet the qualifications. We interviewed a DIS Counselor from a Non Public Agency today and we are looking to move forward with this candidate pending clearance. The plan is to have the candidate start with a 3-day schedule and assess the need as we go.
- Counselor: We flew a Counselor position pool and had 5 qualified candidates. Interviews are scheduled for tomorrow afternoon. All 5 have confirmed their attendance. One of our counselors at the HS is currently on leave until the end of the year.
- The Social Emotional needs of our students have continued to escalate and it's important we prioritize support in this area. Our counselors have been at the forefront in this area and it's important we continue to support our counseling team. Currently up to the end of February we have had 48 students demonstrate suicidal ideations including self-harm. In the years past, for the full year there was a total of 24 in 2018-19, 29 in 2017-18, 14 in 2016-17. As you can see we have doubled the numbers and we have just entered into the month of March.
- Classified Employee of the Year Nominations have been sent out

- In Virtual Academy even with the COVID-19 pandemic being less threatening, we still have a robust number of students in the TC Virtual Academy. As of today we have 128 students in secondary with a strong showing in 12th graders and over 300 students in elementary dispersed across all grade levels. That is a good sign that the education they are receiving meets our family's needs.
- In Technology we received a memo from LACOE technology services last week relaying an advisory and guidance regarding Cybersecurity in light of the current conflict between Russia and Ukraine. We have reviewed our current cybersecurity based on their recommendations and are evaluating what we already have in place and any additional measures we will take.
